It reflects how we are doing on increasing Members' understanding of the digital world and the policies that impact it. We look forward to continuing our efforts to educate policymakers about the changes taking place in our industry. We trust that with greater understanding will come public policies that encourage innovation and sustain America's economic growth and leadership in the Information Age. ITI's High Tech Voting Guide is one of only two business group ratings to be published in the Almanac of American Politics.

Vote Key-House:

1. H.R. 1 – The No Child Left Behind Act:

Improving America's education system is a priority of the IT industry. H.R. 1 is consistent with education principles advocated by ITI, including a meaningful system of annual testing aligned to high academic standards and important focus on math and science education. The bill was passed by a vote of 384 – 45. The pro-IT vote was "yes".

2. H.J. Res. 50 – Normal Trade Relations for China:

H.J. Res. 50 would have stripped China of its normal trading status. Few issues are as important to the future growth of the IT sector than free and fair trade. Maintaining normal trade relations with China is a necessary step on the path toward that goal. The resolution was defeated by a vote of 169 – 259. The pro-IT vote was "no".

3. H.R. 3005 – The Bipartisan Trade Promotion Authority Act of 2001:**

Expanded market access for IT products abroad is a crucial issue to our sector. H.R. 3005 empowers the Administration to negotiate trade agreements and have them receive approval or disapproval in Congress without amendments. This process will increase trade opportunities by reassuring our trading partners that the result of difficult and technical negotiations will not be changed by the Congress. The bill was passed by a vote of 215 – 214. The pro-IT vote was "yes".

4. House Judiciary Committee vote on the Bachus amendment to H.R. 1552 –The Internet Tax Nondiscrimination Act:

The Bachus amendment would have reduced the length of the extension of the moratorium on Internet access taxes from 5 years to 8 months. ITI has long supported the 5-year extension in H.R. 1552. The amendment was defeated by a vote of 12 – 19. The pro-IT vote was "no".

5. House International Relations Committee vote to report out H.R. 2568 – The Export Administration Act (EAA) of 2001:

The IT industry supports reform of our nation's export control system. The Committee's bill would have unduly restricted the industry's ability to export and would undermine the President's efforts to develop and implement a new, more effective system of national security export controls. The bill was reported out of Committee with a vote of 26 – 7. The pro-IT vote was "no".

6. H.R. 3090: Job Creation and Worker Assistance Act of 2002:

H.R. 3090, the economic stimulus bill, includes a 30 percent bonus depreciation allowance for capital investments, including IT products. ITI has long supported updating depreciation schedules to better reflect the fast-growing technology sector. The bonus depreciation provision included in the stimulus is consistent with that goal. H.R. 3090 was passed by a vote of 417 – 3. The pro-IT vote was "yes".

7. H.R. 3482: Cyber Security Enhancement Act:

H.R. 3482 allows for greater consideration of the sophistication and intent of an attack when sentencing a convicted cyber-criminal. This change will allow the sentences imposed on these criminals to more adequately reflect the seriousness of these crimes. Cyber-crimes perpetrated by hackers can disable critical information systems, cost our economy billions of dollars and diminish citizens' confidence in Internet safety and security. H.R. 3482 was passed by a vote of 385 – 3. The pro-IT vote was "yes".

8. Schakowsky amendment to H.R. 5005, the Homeland Security Act of 2002:

The Schakowsky amendment to H.R. 5005 would have stripped from the bill an exemption from the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) for critical infrastructure information voluntarily submitted to the proposed Department of Homeland Security. ITI has long supported exempting this critical infrastructure information from FOIA. With over 85 percent of all critical systems controlled by the private sector, greater cooperation between government and industry is vital to ensuring the safety of these systems. The amendment was defeated by a vote of 188 – 240. The pro-IT vote was "no".

9. Conference Report to H.R. 3009, the Trade Act of 2002**:

This is the conference report to the Trade Promotion Authority (TPA) legislation. TPA empowers the Administration to negotiate trade agreements and have them receive approval or disapproval in Congress without amendments. The conference report was passed by a vote of 215 – 212. The pro-IT vote was "yes".

*** The House votes on TPA passage and the TPA conference report are double-weighted to reflect the importance of trade to the IT industry and the closeness of these votes.*

Vote Key-Senate:

1. S. 1 – Better Education for Students and Teachers Act:

Improving America's education system is a priority of the IT industry. S. 1 is consistent with education principles advocated by ITI, including a meaningful system of annual testing aligned to high academic standards and important focus on math and science education. The bill was passed by a vote of 91 – 8. **The pro-IT vote was "yes".**

2. S. 149 – The Export Administration Act of 2001

The IT industry supports reform of our nation's export control system. S. 149 modernizes export controls. In particular, it includes important provisions that would eliminate the obsolete concept of MTOP's (millions of theoretical operations per second) from consideration of a product's national security implications. Repeal of the MTOP's standard is a top ITI priority. The bill was passed by a vote of 85 – 14. **The pro-IT vote was "yes".**

3. Motion to table the Enzi amendment to H.R. 1552 – the Internet Tax Nondiscrimination Act:

H.R. 1552, as passed by the House, extended the moratorium on Internet access taxes for 2 years. The Enzi substitute amendment would have allowed sales-tax collections on remote sales without reasonable safeguards to ensure states had simplified their sales tax systems. The amendment was tabled by a vote of 57 – 43. **The pro-IT vote was "yes".**

4. H.R. 3090: Job Creation and Worker Assistance Act of 2002:

H.R. 3090, the economic stimulus bill, includes a 30 percent bonus depreciation allowance for capital investments, including IT products. ITI has long supported updating depreciation schedules to better reflect the fast-growing technology sector. The bonus depreciation provision included in the stimulus is consistent with that goal. H.R. 3090 was passed by a vote of 85 – 9. **The pro-IT vote was "yes".**

5. H.R. 3009 – The Trade Act of 2002:

Expanded market access for IT products abroad is a crucial issue to our sector. H.R. 3009 includes Trade Promotion Authority legislation that empowers the Administration to negotiate trade agreements and have them receive approval or disapproval in Congress without amendments. This process will increase trade opportunities by reassuring our trading partners that the result of difficult and technical negotiations will not be changed by the Congress. The bill was passed by a vote of 66 – 30. **The pro-IT vote was "yes".**

6. Conference Report to H.R. 3009, the Trade Act of 2002:

This is the conference report to the Trade Promotion Authority (TPA) legislation. TPA empowers the Administration to negotiate trade agreements and have them receive approval or disapproval in Congress without amendments. The conference report passed by a vote of 64 – 34. **The pro-IT vote was "yes".**

7. S. 2201 – The Online Privacy Protection Act:

Sen. Hollings' (D-SC) privacy legislation would have discriminated against e-commerce by imposing more restrictive data regulations on online transactions and authorizing private lawsuits. It would also impose broad, prescriptive “access” and security mandates. By a vote of 15 - 8, the Commerce Committee approved S. 2201. **The pro-IT vote was “no.”**
